

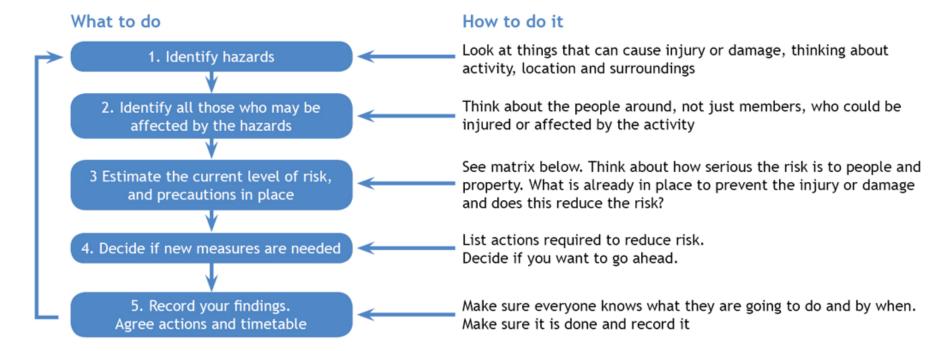
Risk Assessment: Event/Activity

Using this template, you should risk assess activities, trips and events in line with Girlguiding's Risk Assessment Policy. Using the information on the website and this cover page, you should be able to identify effective risk management strategies and tasks to ensure that activities run safely and effectively.

For more information or support with risk assessments, please speak to your local commissioner.

- Hazards are anything that has the potential to cause harm (e.g. cars, trip hazards, exposed electrical wires, theft, etc.).
- Risk is the likelihood of something happening, combined with the severity of the harm that could be caused by one or more hazards

Risk management is a dynamic cycle that needs to be repeated in order to effectively manage risk. The frequency of reassessment will depend on activity, and new risks could occur that have not previously been assessed. In this instance, a dynamic risk assessment is required.

Pond	All - drowning	Adult supervision throughout. Dipping to only occur from the banks using telescopic nets provided. Entering the water is not permitted. Throw line provided with equipment in stable block and should be taken to the pond when activity is in progress.	Low	Low	Pond is shallow.	Group leader - ongoing
Pots, trays and other equipment	All - cuts	Participants briefed about using the equipment in the correct way. All equipment checked at beginning and end of session to ensure no broken, sharp plastic. Any broken equipment to be reported to the Deer Park team.	Low	Low	Equipment checked regularly by Centre team.	Group leader - ongoing Deer Park team - quarterly

Losing balance with nets	All -injury, falling in the water	Participants briefed about safe way to use nets, including safe distances from others, avoiding leaning too far with net or picking up large, submerged objects. Be mindful of the length of the pole and possibility of catching eyes and other body parts, especially with people crouching down.	Low	Low		Group leader - at the start of each session
Contact with microorganisms	All - disease	All participants to wash hands thoroughly and/or use anti-bacterial gel after handling wildlife and equipment and before eating or drinking. Seek medical attention if symptoms occur.	Low	Low		Group leader - at the end of each session

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Humans damaging the environment	Wildlife - death	Make participants aware of the importance of the welfare of the animals they are handling. Pots pre-prepared with pond water and a little vegetation for shelter. Keep the containers nearby and do not keep invertebrates out in strong sun. Where possible, do not keep predators in the same container as their prey. Use the right size container for animal and be mindful of delicate body parts. Release back to same habitat. If necessary, change plans. Ensure participants have suitable and adequate clothing including sun protection. Wasps	All - Stings	A check for the presence of wasp nests should be done prior to any session. Any evidence of a nest should be reported to the Deer Park team as soon as possible.	Low	Low		Group leader - prior to each session
Lack of 1 st aid provision	All - worsening injury	Activity is group leader led and therefore the visiting group is responsible for having a suitably qualified 1st aider and a 1st aid kit.	Low	Low		Group leader - prior to the activity starting
